Advent 2020 Engaging the Senses

Dear Saints of United, On November 29th we will begin the church new year with the season of Advent. Advent means "to come"

and we prepare for the coming of Jesus in the manger, in our daily lives, and in his promised 2nd coming. This Advent will be different as we will not have as many in person opportunities to come together. But we will have some. Your worship planning committee has put together some Advent Preparedness Kits to help you engage your senses as you journey toward Christmas. Here are some of the ways you might use your kit during the season.

- Nov. 29th Worship via zoom at 9:30 a.m. Light your candle as we begin worship singing "Light One Candle to Watch for Messiah." Have your ELW in front of you so you can sing along. Plan to light this candle each week. If you have an Advent wreath, add your own candles to the celebration.
- Dec. 2 Bundle up and come to our Christmas Tree Lighting Service **at United as we sing Holden Evening Prayer at 7:00p.m.** It will be dark and likely rainy so come prepared with your own hot beverage and flashlight.
- Dec. 6 Worship via zoom at 9:30 a.m. Pull out your ELW and finger Labyrinth as you



	prepare for worship. Plan as an individual or as a family to come walk the labyrinth set up in our Fellowship Hall
Dec. 9	Join Pastor Eric via Zoom at 7:00 p.m. with your ELW as we sing through Compline. Light your candle and pull ou your devotional as Pastor Eric will refer to it.
Dec. 13	Worship via zoom at 9:30 a.m. Find some blue in your house and add it to your worship space as you come to worship. Light your candle and two others if you have them. Listen to the message of hope as proclaimed in Isaiah 61.
Dec. 16	Join us via zoom at 7:00p.m. as Philip and Pastor Eric prepare a Christmas Carol sing- a-long in the privacy of your own home. Your ELW will be very helpful

Dec. 20 On this 4th Sunday of Advent, worship again begins at 9:30 a.m. via zoom. Pull out your Myrrh scented oil as we engage the sense of smell during worship.

Dec. 21 Mark your calendars for the Winter Solstice. This is a Monday. We will celebrate a Blue Christmas via zoom at 7p.m. as we acknowledge that this can be a difficult season for those who have lost loved ones. Again, have your scented oil available as we use this as a healing oil for the day. Come and relax into a meditative Christmas service that acknowledges that darkness is difficult.

Come as we do a **20-minute outdoor service in our parking lot at 4:00p.m.** We will light candles, sing Silent Night, and celebrate the coming of the Christ child. **Zoom worship will be at 7p.m.** with a Christmas Homily and familiar carols. Join us

Join us for a simple service at **9:30 a.m. via zoom.** There will be more information to come. Maybe we will have some of our new equipment up and running. Time will tell.

The Annual Meeting will be held on February 7, at 10:30 (following the worship service).



A new copier will be needed likely in the next calendar year. A discussion will continue on whether to lease or buy our next machine. Our current machine has over 1 million copies and parts are becoming obsolete.

Pastor Eric reported there will be brief outdoor worship services on **Dec. 2 at 7:00p.m.** (using an abbreviated Holden Evening Prayer Service), and on **Christmas Eve at 4:00 p.m.** using a brief readings and carols service. A live zoom service will happen at **7:00p.m. on Christmas Eve.**

Council hopes to have a new constitution to present for approval of the congregation at the annual meeting.

COVID Response Team continues to monitor the situation. As cases are on the rise, masks will continue to be required as people enter the building.

The first household is a grandmother and her adult son





Food for Lane County is handing out lunches to go. They are currently using hired staff and a limited number of volunteers. They are handing out an average of 60-80 lunches a day, 4 days a week.

For Lane County While we can't help in the kitchen, what we can do is bake

cookies/bars/sweet breads, etc. that can be packaged as dessert. We currently have 4-5 people baking about once a month to meet our goal of delivering one batch of home baked goods a week. If you are interested in baking please contact Cara - 541-324-2780.



The earth is awash in plastic of all sorts, and plastics take hundreds of years to decompose, if ever. They just become smaller and smaller pieces which get into the digestive

systems of animals we eat and the air we breathe.

EarthKeepers has been researching ways to use less plastic, and here are two ways you can make a small change which might have big effect:

1. Buy your shampoo in bar form.

Soapboxsoaps.com sells a bar of shampoo which lathers quickly and cleans hair well. It comes in a cardboard box. Made with naturally derived ingredients, it is safe on colored hair, is cruelty free, vegan, and made in the USA. Your purchase donates soap to someone in need. Soap=Hope.

2. Buy your household cleaners from a local company which provides refills. **Werefillit.com** carries dish detergent, laundry detergent, liquid hand soap, and other household cleaning products. They deliver to your doorstep. If you leave a quart canning jar out for them they will exchange it for a full quart canning jar. Consider ordering from them to try out the cleaning products (from **azureclean.com**, also an Oregon company). The whole issue of recycling has been confusing across Oregon. To read an update from OPB, "Oregon Wants Companies to Help Pay for New Recycling System" go to **Interfaithearthkeepers.org.**

Meanwhile, try to purchase products in glass or biodegradable containers. Talk to store managers, requesting products in other-than-plastic packaging. **EarthKeepers** is building a list of locally available plastic-free products; please let us know if you have additions to our list. Share your successes with others. We are looking for new ideas! -Eunice Kjaer


